





The fascinating light installations, Instagram-worthy decorations and smell of freshly made food permeating the air will surely draw you to one of the many restaurants that line the streets of Brickfields to celebrate with the locals. Follow the scent trail of floral garlands and incense while browsing through stalls hawking gold jewellery, traditional snacks, embroidered sari (traditional Indian womenswear) and ornamental decorations while you soak in the lively atmosphere.

As one of the major cultural festivals in Malaysia, Deepavali (also known as "Diwali" or the "Festival of Lights") is a celebration that marks the triumph of good over evil. It's when thousands of Hindu families around the country, and across the world transform their homes into beacons of light, exchange gifts, share feasts and perform pooja (prayers) to deities such as Lakshmi, the goddess of fertility and prosperity.

Brickfields is a neighbourhood located on the western part of central Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and perhaps best known as Kuala Lumpur's Little India due to the high percentage of Indian residents and businesses.






A NOT SO SLEEPY PAST

According to history book, a flood swept through Kuala Lumpur in the wake of a disastrous fire in 1881. These successive problems destroyed the town's structures of wood and thatching and in a swift response to that, Frank Swettenham, the British Resident of Selangor, required that buildings be constructed of brick and tile. Hence, Kapitan Yap Ah Loy bought a sprawling piece of real estate, now called Brickfields, for the setting up of a brick industry which would spur the rebuilding of Kuala Lumpur.

Later the area was developed by Yap Kwan Seng, the fifth and last Kapitan Cina of Kuala Lumpur. As a businessman, he foresaw an increased demand for bricks in fast-growing Kuala Lumpur and established a kiln in the district. The area soon became the centre for brick-making in the early days because the whole area was a clay pit and good quality bricks are made from clay. Therefore, Brickfields became synonymous with good quality bricks.

Brickfields also used to be the site of the main depot for Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTM) (Malayan Railway) during the administration of the British. The British authorities brought in people from Sri Lanka to work the railway and the depot. Many lived in quarters around Brickfields. Since then, the Indian community have lived and remained here and became citizens of Malaysia. Some of the old quarters were last found found around Jalan Rozario. Today, what's left are just memories of those quarters which has since been transformed into a buzzing transportation hub called KL Sentral, the city's central railway hub



CULTURE COMES ALIVE

Vivekananda Ashram, Brickfields

While records show that it was the lush traveller's palm tree and mangosteens that stole the heart of Swami Vivekananda during his travels through Asia in the late 1800s, it was really his teachings that would go on to capture the hearts and minds of thousands in the region for over a hundred years.

More than a century after his Malaya visit, the Vivekananda Ashram — built in 1904 — continues to be the calm in the middle of bustling, modernday Brickfields.


Vivekananda, known in his pre-monastic life as Narendranath Datta, was on his way to the World Parliament of Religions in Chicago in 1893. Vivekananda had taken notes while moving through Asia, observing in his notes "the beautiful fan-like palm, called the traveller's palm, grows here in abundance and the bread-fruit tree everywhere."


He had visited Penang and Singapore and was immediately enchanted by the landscape of this region, observing how Penang was once faced with the threat of pirates, and how he found the people of Singapore "not half so dark as the people of Madras."

While this revered individual was charmed by Southeast Asia's landscapes, his teachings had inspired thousands to continue his work in improving the lives of the disadvantaged and the poor. His teachings had become so great an influence in local communities that followers paid tribute to him through the establishment of the Vivekananda Ashram in Brickfields in 1904.

The ashram is said to have been built by Sri Lankan (Jaffna) Tamil migrants to pay tribute to Vivekananda. This building was part of an expansion of the Ramakrishna Mission in Singapore in 1896. Although there was no evidence of him visiting Kuala Lumpur at that time, the movement was driven to continue his work in educating and supporting the underprivileged through this ashram.


Located south of Kuala Lumpur city center, Brickfields' Little India is a stone's throw away from KL Sentral, Malaysia's main transportation hub. Getting here has never been easier and it boasts delightful Indian cuisine. Brickfields is tagged as a "Divine Location" as it houses various religious structures.






Budhist Maha Vihara

The Buddhist Maha Vihara was founded by the Sinhalese community based in Kuala Lumpur and the surrounding areas in 1894 to provide a place of worship in their Sri Lankan Theravada tradition. Most of Sinhalese were either traders or artisans and skilled workers brought in from Cevlon by the British Administration to develop the colonial Malayan Civil Service.



Sri Kandaswany Kovil

Sri Kandaswamy Kovil is a Hindu temple located along Jalan Scott, Brickfields in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The temple is over a century old. It is one of the most prominent Sri Lankan Tamil or Ceylonese Tamil temples in Malaysia. It is huge and showcases rich Sri Lankan Tamil architecture and has become a popular tourist attraction in Kuala Lumpur. The temple architecture is inspired by the Nallur Kandaswamy temple in Jaffna, Sri Lanka. It is reputed to be one of the most orthodox temples in Malaysia where rituals are followed strictly in accordance the rules of Saiva Agama Scriptures.

Sam Kow Tong Temple

Finally, another significant landmark in Brickfields is the distinctive Chinese Temple known as Sam Kow Tong Temple, which means "Hall of Three Teachings" along Jalan Thambillay. The Temple was founded in 1916 and belonged to the Heng Hua clan in Hokkien Province. There is also another Chinese Temple, Seng Hong Tokong along Jalan Berhala.




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TRIPS YOU NEED TO TAKE AS SOON AS YOU RETIRE

Like Mansel, your mode of transport should help you decide just how much you can feasibly pack and which size of luggage you should choose.

Know your airline's weight limit

"If I'm flying and checking a bag, I know the 50-pound weight limit comes quickly, and I'll need to be mindful of how much I'm actually packing into the suitcase" Mansel says, noting the average weight limit for checked luggage across major airlines. "In this instance, I'll use my Away suitcase, which is just under 12 pounds. I'll then pack normally and weigh the bag with a handheld weight scale. With a couple of pairs of shoes and my toiletries, I typically average 47 pounds, giving me a little wiggle room if I pick up any souvenirs on my travels."

Do make every inch of space count

No matter which method of packing you choose, Mansel says it's critical to make use of every inch of space you have in your luggage — including some often-overlooked spots.

Each piece of clothing, she says, should be folded or rolled as tightly as possible and squeezed into "every square inch of extra space, including inside my shoes." Yes, you read that right. If you can, try rolling up socks, underwear, or smaller t-shirts and stuff them inside boots or sneakers. The little added space really can make a huge difference and packing your shoes this way helps maintain their shape.

Invest in packing cubes to stay organized.

A chaotic bag can kill a travel mood, which is why Mansel says investing in packing cubes or compression packing cubes is a good idea.

Go ahead and splurge on toiletry capsules.

Toiletries can be the bane of every traveler's packing experience. Finding the right size and the right amount of space for all your serums, creams, and cleansers can be annoying, which is why Mansel says this one Insta-famous knick-knack is actually worth it.

Don't forget the steamer.

No matter how you pack — roll, fold, use cubes, are minimalist, whatever — your clothing will inevitably get wrinkled in transit. And that's why Mansel says it's critical to always leave room for a steamer.

Apple Cranberry Moscow Mule

Ingredients

- 2 ounces vodka
- 1 ounce cran-apple juice
- 1/4 ounce lime juice, freshly squeezed
- Ginger beer, chilled, to top
- Garnish: apple slice
- Garnish: cranberries

Method

- Pour the vodka, cran-apple juice and lime juice into a mule mug, highball glass or rocks glass filled with ice, and stir briefly to combine.
- Top with ginger beer.
- Garnish with an apple slice and fresh cranberries.



Last Minute Mulled Wine

Ingredients

- 1 bottle fruity red wine (such as beaujolais or syrah)
- 4 ounces bourbon or brandy
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 4 star anise pods
- 2 long strips lemon peel or orange peel
- Garnish: 6 cinnamon sticks

Method

- Add the red wine, bourbon or brandy, sugar, star anise pods and lemon or orange peels into a small saucepan, and heat over low heat until warm, but do not allow to boil.
- Remove from heat and let stand for 5 to 10 minutes.
- Divide between six mugs or punch cups.
- Garnish each drink with a cinnamon stick.



Thanksgiving Margarita

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon ground ginger
- 1 tablespoon sea salt
- 1 lime wedge
- 1 1/2 ounces reposado tequila
- 1/4 ounce allspice dram
- 1/4 ounce amaretto
- 1 ounce pumpkin puree
- 3/4 ounce lime juice, freshly squeezed
- 1/2 ounce agave nectar
- Garnish: roasted pumpkin slice

Method

- On a small plate, combine the ground ginger and sea salt. Rub the lime wedge along half of the rim of a rocks glass and dip the glass in the mixture. (For a finer texture, pound the ginger and sea salt with a mortar and pestle.)
- -Add the tequila, allspice dram, amaretto, pumpkin puree, lime juice and agave nectar into a shaker with ice and shake until well-chilled.
- Strain into the prepared glass over fresh ice.
- Garnish with a roasted pumpkin slice.



Pumpkin Nog

Ingredients

- 12 eggs
- 1/2 pound sugar, divided
- 750 milliliters light rum (Abou-Ganim used 10 Cane)
- 5 cups whole milk
- 1/2 cup pumpkin puree
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Garnish: whipped cream
- Garnish: freshly grated nutmeg

Method

- Separate the eggs and refrigerate the whites.
- In a mixing bowl, beat the yolks until creamy.
- Gradually add in 1/4 pound sugar, beating at high speed until thick.
- Stir in the rum, milk, pumpkin, vanilla and cinnamon, and chill for at least two hours.
- Beat the egg whites until soft peaks form.
- Add the remaining 1/4 pound sugar, beating the egg whites to stiff peaks.
- Fold the chilled rum mixture into the egg whites.
- Serve in Martini glasses garnished with a dollop of whipped cream and freshly grated nutmeg.

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


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Routes World 2023: A Resounding Success

The recently concluded Routes World 2023 (RW23), hosted by iGA Istanbul Airport in Turkiye, recorded more than 3,300 delegates from airlines, airports and tourism authorities and service providers.

The attendee list on its website showed 692 organisations participating in its 28th edition to discuss the future of the aviation industry and more importantly routes development.

Over 13,000 networking meetings were held during RW23, which was attended by some 260 airlines. Malaysia Airports itself had more than 30 meetings with the airlines.

RW23 is said to be the first event that China's largest carriers - Air China, China Eastern Airlines, China Southern Airlines, Hainan Airlines and Shandong Airlines - attended following the lifting of the COVID-19 travel restrictions earlier this year by the mainland Chinese government.

Part and parcel of RW23, its 2.5-day conference saw participation from associations, airline leaders, government ministers and suppliers with its programme featuring many interesting panel discussions.

Day one panellists discussed about evolving travel trends of sustainable tourism, what is next for route development and the future of aviation in various regions, including Asia Pacific (APAC).

Sharing insights into the future of the Saudi Arabian aviation sector, Ali Rajab, Chief Executive Officer of Saudi Air Connectivity Programme stressed the importance of unified laws in sustainable tourism which will not only benefit travellers but will also contribute to environmental sustainability.

By having consistent and harmonised regulations, he believed the aviation industry could adapt more seamlessly to changing circumstances.

Future of aviation in APAC

On regional trends in APAC, Dilhan Haradasa, Group head of network and regulatory affairs of AirAsia, envisaged India to be the new global dominant aviation player in the next five years.

With China not bouncing back as expected, India has become a significant growth market for Southeast Asia (SEA). Haradasa said AirAsia is also eyeing flying to secondary-tier airports in Australia, particularly from Indonesia.

He added that the low-cost carrier (LCC) plans to begin flights via its new Cambodian air operator's certificate by end-2023. However, it will be subject to AirAsia securing the two Airbus A320s.

The LCC will initially operate from Phnom Penh to ASEAN and domestic destinations in Cambodia as well, with plans to grow Sihanoukville and Siam Reap.

The RW23 Conference also zoomed in on airlines in SEA. Among them is Thai Airways/Thai Smiles' restructuring plan where Thiti Arayakhun, Head of Scheduling of Thai Airways, said the integration of Thai Smile subsidiary into the parent company is on track.



Once it is completed by January 2024, the airline will be operating 69 planes.

Meanwhile, two of Thai Smile's Airbus A320s have been transferred into the Thai flag carrier's fleet in early October with eight more by year-end and the remaining four by January 5, 2024

Arayakhun added that Thai Airways will be taking over routes previously served by Thai Smile, including Kaohsiung (Taiwan), Kolkata (India) and Penang (Malaysia).

Its focus in 2024 will be on route resumptions to Milan and Oslo in Europe, and Japan. The Star Alliance member will also be increasing its frequencies in existing markets such as Sydney, Australia.

Day three of the RW Conference also provided the platform for the attendees to find out all they need to know about Thailand's new start-up, Really Cool Airlines from Wutcharin Thatan, its head of commercial.

The carrier plans to start full-service operations in 2024. Already been granted the air operating licence, it is now waiting to receive its air operator certificate from the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand.

Routes World Awards 2023

Another highlight of Routes World 2023 is the recognition or awards given to outstanding achievements by stakeholders in the route development industry that have helped to restore and advance global air connectivity.

This year Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport (CDG) was named the Overall Winner as well as triumphing in the Over 20 Million Passengers category.

The other winners included Brussels Airport for the 10-20 Million Passengers category, Larnaka International Airport (5-10 Million Passengers) and Newcastle International Airport (Under 5 Million Passengers).

Cape Town Air Access bagged the Destination award for a second consecutive year. Spanish carrier, Vueling Airlines, won the Airline category while Tatamo Rakotozafy, head of aviation marketing at Ravinala Airports Madagascar, won the Rising Star award.

Lastly, Vicki Jaramillo, Executive Vice President and Chief Development Office of Orlando International Airport took home the Individual Leadership Award, which celebrates the lifetime achievement of the individual within the route development community during the course of their career.

Mohamed Sallauddin Mat Sah, former General Manager of Aviation Marketing and Development of Malaysia Airports, was one of the five candidates shortlisted for this hotly contested award.

The 29th edition of this prestigious event will be heading to the Kingdom of Bahrain from October 6-8, 2024 while Routes Asia, last hosted by Malaysia Airports in 2014, will be held in Malaysia from February 27-29, 2024.



Airlines' latest purchase is reportedly its largest order of the C919 from the manufacturer, Commercial Aircraft Corporation of China. These new jets are expected to be delivered from 2024 to 2031.

As the first to use the C919, China Eastern Airlines has so far received three out of five from its earlier purchase, with the remaining two to be delivered later this year.






Yong Mun Sen "Boats, 1944" Oil on Canvas 47 x 52 cm

Dubbed as the Father of Malaysian painting, the late Yong Mun Sen, born on Jan 10, 1896 was one of Malaysia's pioneer artists. The country's art scene is as vibrant and diverse as it is today due to his pertinent contributions. As one of the innovating self-taught artist, Yong left a strong legacy of watercolour and oils. Born in Kuching, Sarawak where his father ran a coconut estate, in 1901 Sen went to Dabu County in Meizhou City, Kwanatuna (now Guanadona) Province in China for schooling in brush use and calligraphy and returned to Kuching in 1910. Sen always spoke of how seeing a Japanese artist painting with watercolors had made an indelible impression on him. He is widely known as the Father of Malaysian Painting. Although trained in formal Chinese brush painting and calligraphy in China, as an artist he was drawn to watercolours and later oils. Sen returned to China in 1914. His paintings during this visit were marked by a arandiose theme.

He painted lions and tigers, images that were hugely popular with the warlords of the time. He married Lam Sek Foong in 1916, and returned to Sarawak in 1917. He settled in Penang in 1922, where he had his own art studios on Penang Road and later Northam Road. Mun Sen is noted for his watercolour landscape paintings, which incorporate influences from Chinese art resulting in more airy and generalised compositions rather than in more detailed or factual depictions. Since his death in 1962, his works have retained an important and honoured place in Malaysian art.

Lee Man Fong, born in 1913 in Guangzhou, China, is one of the most important pioneer artists of Southeast Asia and his importance is growing as more of his paintings are being exhibited and published. Fong moved to Singapore in 1917 and studied at the Anglo-Chinese School until 1929. In 1932 he migrated to Java and worked for Kolff, a Dutch printing and publishing company. In 1936 the head of the Dutch East Indies Association in Batavia invited Fong to participate in an exhibition, a great honor since he was the first non-Dutch artist to be given this invitation.



He was married to Lie Muk Lan, a pianist, and their son Lee Rem, born in 1938, also became a painter who would later exhibit jointly with his father. After 1940 Fong devoted himself full-time to painting. He visited Bali, working briefly there, and held solo shows in Jakarta and Bandung. Artist quickly gained recognition for his paintings of Balinese subjects, many influenced by the work of Willem Hofker. He did a series of large paintings depictiong various activites in Bali's daily life which are remarkable. Fong held a solo show in Jakarta in 1941, after which he was interned by the Japanese. In 1949 he was awarded a Malino scholarhip to study art in the Netherlands. He was there for three years, and then returned to Indonesia where his talent was acknowledged by President Soekarno, to whom Fong became an art advisor. Lee Man Fong had his training in China and Western Europe, and lived most of his life in Indonesia, developing a particular style that amalgamated his teachings with a quiet yet passionate vision. His works are highly coveted by many for the fusion of Chinese brushwork and Western techniques which resulted in richly sentimental yet elegant paintings. A leading painter and curator of his time, the artist pioneered the Nanyang style in the 20th century in Indonesia.

Cheona Soo Piena had a dominant influence on the development of modern art in Singapore and is regarded as one of Singapore's pioneer artists. His innovative experimentations towards developing his stylistic oeuvre had a great influence on his students, many of whom later became established artists in the region. Cheong was a multi-faceted artist, he experimented with Western art styles and was known to have progressed through several phases in a short span of time: from Post-Impressionism to Cubism to abstraction and semi-abstraction. 'Fishing Village' may have been completed during the 1950s when Cheong was experimenting with oil in impasto effects and Cubism. The painting depicts a cluster of huts.



However, the artist himself said that his social commentaries did not change despite the change of atmosphere. It still had social remarks. He also said life is a bit like the lives of humans. Purposeless and unorchestrated at times, but it brings a lot of pleasure. This social commentary was brought to canvas, based on his studies on human behaviour teamed with lines, colours and motion. The end-result of a seamless flow of lovely colours amalgamating with one another was not intentionally meant to look aesthetic and flowing. The initial lines and sketches were rough, chaotic and arbitrary, to portray the human behaviour of being wild and free.

Tajuddin Ismail is a reputable artist worthy of respect and recognition for his amazing abstract art that draws inspiration from natural forms and landscapes. His distinctive style has lured many art enthusiasts into his realm of innovative, complex artistry. To Tajuddin, just as how music is able to make a connection with the listener, art is the same. It is all about making a visual connection with what one is seeing.

Born in 1949 in Negeri Sembilan, Tajuddin had a deep-rooted passion for art at an early age. He not only possesses great talent, but he also has a solid educational foundation in art as well. He studied Fine Art at the MARA University Institute of Technology (UiTM) in Malaysia and then pursued Graphic Design at the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles, USA. In 1987, he was granted the Fulbright Research Fellowship by the American Council of Learned Societies of New York. In 1975, Tajuddin became a senior lecturer and an associate professor of design at UiTM's Faculty of Architecture.

The renowned artist has participated in more than 150 solo and group exhibitions in Malaysia and throughout countries in Asia, South America, Europe, and USA since the late 1960's. Active for almost five decades, Tajuddin has won numerous Art and Design awards nationally and his artworks can be found in private art collections, museums, exhibitions and corporations in Asia, the Middle East, Europe and America.

Abdullah Ariff was born on June 15, 1904 in Georgetown, Penang. He was a self-taught artist and an instructor of the Penang Impressionist in 1898 — an exclusive group of expatriate artists. The members of this group were the wives of Europeans and a few local members such as Mrs. Lim Cheng Kung, who was accepted due to her patronage. The artist was a pioneer of watercolour art in Malaysia together with Yong Mun Sen. Renowned for his meticulous and masterful handling of the watercolour medium, Abdullah employed a European technique and approach to his work compared to his contemporary, Yong Mun Sen.

Despite his young age, Abdullah was accepted in the Anglo-Chinese School (ACS), Penang at a mere nine years old and managed to pass his Senior Cambridge in 1925. Due to his educational background and enthusiasm in art, he was accepted by Rev. G. F. Pykett and later on hired as an art teacher at the ACS. This was no easy feat as Western education was not easily available to non-aristocratic Malays and art education was not encouraged by the British in Malaya. He was later promoted to Supervisor of Art until the Japanese Occupation in 1941.

Khalil Ibrahim was a multifaceted artist who forayed into many art mediums and excelled in each, proving his legendary status. Aptly named as a multifaceted maestro, Khalil was born in 1934 In Kubang Krian, Kelantan. He was one of the earliest Malaysians to receive a full scholarship to study art at the prestigious Central St Martins School of Art and Design in London. Throughout his long career, Khalil had held a number of solo and group exhibitions in Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia and Switzerland. His masterful skills in drawing, watercolour and acrylic, are styles that move from the almost real to the almost abstract.

Owning a piece of his artwork is truly a gift of beauty through the artist's eyes. Khalil's preference for the human figure and his deep affection for the East Coast had led him to create iconic images of men and women in the East Coast Malay fishing villages against stark backgrounds of blues and greens and watercolour landscape of villages. Khalil's rich Malay cultural background in the East Coast and the discipline of Islamic values that he learnt at the Pondok school shaped his primordial artistic journey.

These values stuck by him which then merged with with the freedom of expression that he encountered later on through his formal education at St. Martins in London. Though he did not receive any formal education during the early years in Kelantan, Khalil's awareness of modern art was cultivated through a period of colonialism and the experiences of pioneering artists from the Nanyang Academy.







Great Source of Many Nutrients

Nuts are highly nutritious. One ounce (28 grams) of mixed nuts contains calories, proteins, fat (just the right amount you need, and the good type of fat too), carbs, fibres and many more vitamins and minerals your body needs. Some nuts are higher in certain nutrients than others. For instance, just one Brazil nut provides more than 100% of the Reference Daily Intake (RDI) for selenium. The carb content of nuts is highly variable. Hazelnuts, macadamia nuts, and Brazil nuts have fewer than 2 grams of digestible carbs per serving, while cashews have almost 8 digestible carbs per serving. That being said, nuts are generally an excellent food to eat on a low-carb diet.

Loaded With Antioxidants

Nuts are antioxidant powerhouses. Antioxidants, including the polyphenols in nuts, can combat oxidative stress by neutralizing free radicals — unstable molecules that may cause cell damage and increase disease risk. One study found that walnuts have a greater capacity to fight free radicals than fish. Research shows that the antioxidants in walnuts and almonds can protect the delicate fats in your cells from being damaged by oxidation. In one study in 13 people, eating walnuts or almonds increased polyphenol levels and significantly reduced oxidative damage, compared to a control meal.

May Aid Weight Loss


Though they're considered a high-calorie food, research suggests that nuts may help you lose weight. One large study assessing the effects of the Mediterranean diet found that people assigned to eat nuts lost an average of 2 inches (5 cm) from their waists — significantly more than those given olive oil. Almonds have consistently been shown to promote weight loss rather than weight gain in controlled studies. Some research suggests that pistachios aid weight loss as well. In one study in overweight women, those eating almonds lost nearly three times as much weight and experienced a significantly greater decrease in waist size compared to the control group.





May Reduce Inflammation

Nuts have strong anti-inflammatory properties. Inflammation is your body's way of defending itself from injury, bacteria, and other potentially harmful pathogens. However, chronic, long-term inflammation can cause damage to organs and increase disease risk. Research suggests that eating nuts may reduce inflammation and promote healthy aging. In a study on the Mediterranean diet, people whose diets were supplemented with nuts experienced a 35% and 90% decrease in the inflammatory markers C-reactive protein (CRP) and interleukin 6 (IL-6), respectively.
