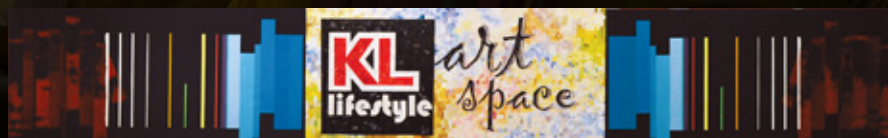

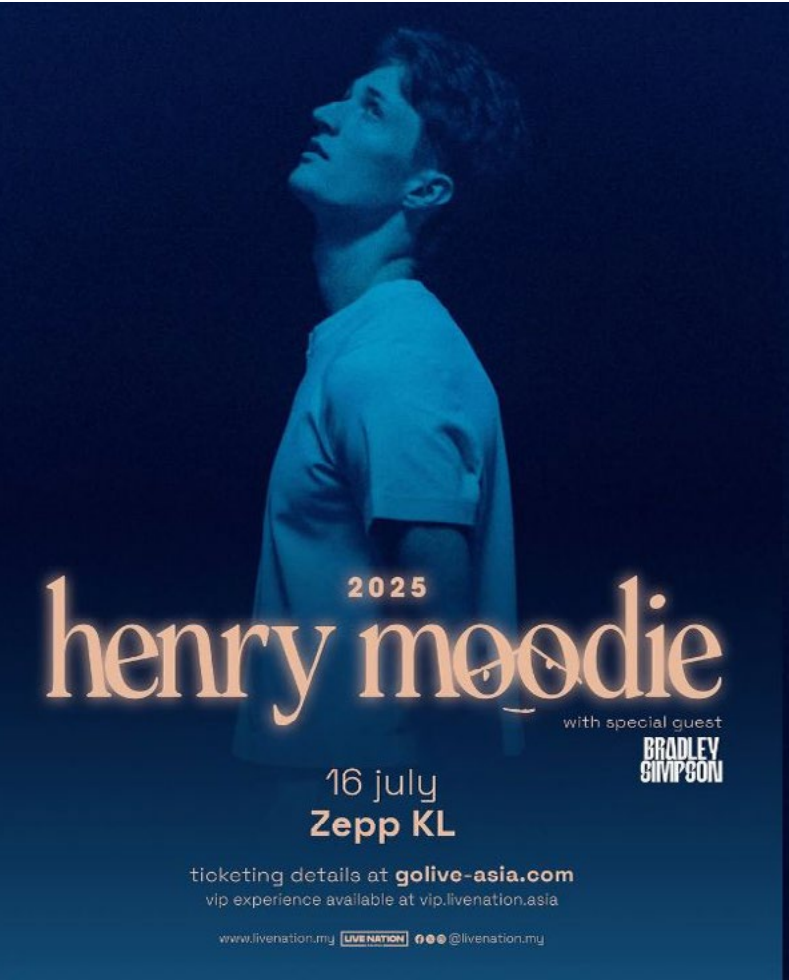

Tracing the Evolution of Malaysian Art

A JOURNEY THROUGH SOME ICONIC RARE AND IMPORTANT ARTWORKS THAT EMBODY NATIONHOOD

Since Malaysia's independence in 1957, the nation has undergone sweeping changes across its political, social, and economic spheres. Yet, some of the most profound and enduring transformations have taken place within its cultural and artistic landscapes. Over the decades, Malaysian art has evolved from a tool for articulating national identity into a dynamic platform for personal expression, political critique, and social dialogue. This post-Merdeka evolution tells a story far richer than mere aesthetics as it reveals the nation's growing pains, cultural tensions, dreams, and inner soul.

In the years following independence, there was a collective urgency to define what it meant to be Malaysian. Art became a vital medium in that nation-building process, a way of expressing cultural pride, unity in diversity, and a shared vision for the future.

Artists began to shift from colonial modes of representation toward forms that reflected Malaysia's multicultural ethos and indigenous heritage.

Figures like Datuk Syed Ahmad Jamal, Latiff Mohidin, and Ibrahim Hussein emerged as pioneering voices in this new visual language.

Their works bridged modernist abstraction with local content, blending Western techniques with Southeast Asian philosophies, Islamic motifs, and vernacular aesthetics.

These artists did not merely reflect the times; they helped shape the ideological framework of post-colonial Malaysia, presenting visual blueprints for a confident and pluralistic society.

These early artworks were both visionary and idealistic. They spoke of hope, progress, and a collective identity yet to be fully realized.

The canvas became a stage for articulating independence, not only from colonial powers but from inherited ideologies, limited narratives, and imposed forms.

Awang Damit Ahmad : A Voice from the Earth

During this period of artistic self-definition, a quiet yet powerful voice began to emerge from the eastern edges of the nation. Awang Damit Ahmad, born in Kuala Penyu in Sabah, brought a sensibility rooted in the earth, rich in memory, textured by emotion, and steeped in spirituality. Unlike the overt symbolism or political rhetoric of his contemporaries, Awang Damit's approach was deeply introspective. His canvases, often abstract and organic, speak to the land, the soul, and the quiet rhythms of rural life.

His early works drew heavily from his childhood in Sabah, capturing the textures of soil, the echoes of local myths, and the weight of memory. His unique visual language resonated with audiences who saw in his works a deep authenticity and emotional gravity.

A milestone in his career and in the trajectory of Malaysian art came in 1988 with his painting titled *Malaysia Masa Kini dan Masa Depan*. Created during a period of intense national transformation marked by industrial growth and urban change, the painting reflects a Malaysia in transition. Its layered abstract forms evoke a delicate balance between continuity and change, heritage and progress, rootedness, and fragmentation.

Rather than presenting a romantic or utopian vision, Awang Damit captured the complexities and contradictions of a nation evolving at high speed. His work explored the emotional costs of development, including the erosion of traditional values, the quiet disappearance of village life, and the disconnection from cultural foundations.

This work marked a turning point not only in his personal practice but in the wider Malaysian art scene. It demonstrated that emotional depth and philosophical insight could live within abstract forms, raising the standard and ambition of Malaysian fine art.

The Expanding Conversation: Identity, Conflict, and Self

By the 1990s, Malaysia's social and political climate was growing more complex. Issues of race, religion, inequality, and national identity were becoming central to policy and public discourse. Art began to reflect these challenges, and many artists adopted a more conceptual and critical approach. The canvas became more than a mirror of culture; it was now a site of inquiry, resistance, and alternative storytelling.

Artists such as Wong Hoy Cheong, Redza Piyadasa, and Zulkifli Yusoff brought a new energy and urgency to Malaysian art. They challenged accepted narratives, questioned historical memory, and examined how policies shaped the lives of ordinary citizens. Their works blurred the boundary between art and activism, inviting discussion, discomfort, and change.

While many artists embraced confrontation and critique, Awang Damit remained committed to quiet reflection and emotional truth. His series, such as *Essence of Culture* and *Payarama* continued to explore the themes of memory, spirituality, and rootedness. His works were not prescriptive but suggestive, offering space for contemplation rather than conclusion. He reminded viewers of the enduring value of silence, soil, and slow attention in an age of noise and speed.

A New Millennium: Decentralization, Diversity, and Digital Frontiers

As Malaysia entered the twenty-first century, the art world expanded in reach and expression. Technological innovation, international mobility, and the rise of independent platforms gave rise to a vibrant new generation of artists, working in a wide range of media. Video art, photography, digital installations, performance pieces, and multidisciplinary collaborations became central to contemporary practice.

Artists such as Yee I Lann, Sharon Chin, and Ahmad Fuad Osman explored themes of environmental crisis, gender identity, indigenous rights, and the legacy of colonialism using contemporary tools and methods. Their works were intellectually agile, emotionally rich, and often deeply collaborative, reflecting a world where personal identity is constantly shaped by history, politics, and technology.

One of the most important shifts during this time was the growing recognition of voices from East Malaysia and the Orang Asli communities. The narrative that had once centered primarily on West Malaysia began to open up, embracing the stories and expressions of artists from Sabah, Sarawak, and other historically marginalized regions. This broadening of the national art conversation was made possible in part by trailblazers like Awang Damit, whose presence in the mainstream affirmed the cultural significance of the periphery.

His success helped redefine who could speak for the nation through art and ensured that the contributions of East Malaysian artists were no longer overlooked or underrepresented.

A Legacy of Truth and Imagination

The evolution of Malaysian art since independence is not just a story of technique and medium. It's a journey of imagination, struggle, memory, and truth. Through artists like Awang Damit Ahmad, we see how art can hold a nation's most intimate emotions, its fears, beauty, dreams, and transform them into something universal.

His work, and that of many others, teaches us that art is never static. It lives, breathes, and evolves alongside its people. It connects generations, challenges silence, and reflects the heartbeat of a changing Malaysia.

Art after independence is not merely a mirror of the nation's growth. It's the pulse of its soul, and it will continue to guide, question, and inspire long into the future.

Mindscape Uprising

PERJUANGAN SERIES AN EXHIBITION OF WORKS ON PAPER BY FUJI ANGGARA

There's a kind of struggle that does not unfold in the streets or on grand stages. It happens in silence, in thought, in the quiet confrontation between artist and canvas, or in this case, paper. In *Mindscape: Perjuangan Series*, Fuji Anggara takes us into this deeply personal realm, where national memory and inner reflection intersect through the medium of paper. This latest mini exhibition at KL Lifestyle Art Space represents a significant moment in Fuji's journey as an artist and individual.

The exhibition will run from 20th July to 8th August 2025 at KLAS @ 150, Jalan Maarof, Bukit Bandaraya, Kuala Lumpur.

Mindscape: Uprising is not a departure, but a continuation and evolution of Fuji's ongoing *Perjuangan series*, shaped by his lived experiences, emotional insights, and deep connection to history. The spark that ignited this series came unexpectedly, in the form of a sculpture. While visiting a public space, Fuji encountered the iconic bust of Tunku Abdul Rahman, sculpted by Felix De Weldon. It moved him profoundly, awakening a deep respect for the struggles of Malaysia's founding fathers and inspiring him to create a body of works that speaks to both national pride and personal conviction.

The *Perjuangan series*, first expressed in two large-scale paintings filled with dynamic strokes and vivid colors of the national flag, celebrated Malaysia's journey to independence and the emotional weight carried by its people. With *Mindscape*, Fuji brings that same spirit inward. These works on paper are not declarations. They are meditations. Here, the act of drawing becomes a form of resistance, a channel for memory, and a space of transformation.

Working with KL Lifestyle Art Space over the years has placed Fuji close to some of Malaysia's most influential modern master artists, whose work is part of the very DNA of the gallery. Through his artistic practice and his exposure to these legends, Fuji has developed a unique voice, one that draws inspiration while carving its own path.

Immortalising History Through Monumental Art

Throughout history, art has served as a medium to express human emotions, commemorate significant events, and immortalise the legacies of remarkable individuals. One such artistic luminary was Tan Sri Felix De Weldon, a gifted sculptor renowned for his masterpieces, including the iconic United States Marine Corps War Memorial and the stately Malaysian Monument,

He channels the emotive energy and motion of Yusof Ghani, whose expressive mark-making and raw physicality are felt in the movement of Fuji's lines. The structural rhythm and bold abstraction of Ibrahim Hussein echo in the way Fuji constructs his visual compositions. The philosophical undertones and spatial poetry of Latiff Mohidin find resonance in Fuji's approach to depth and silence, while Khalil Ibrahim's gentle, introspective handling of the figure is present in Fuji's more restrained and contemplative works.

Mindscape: Uprising also builds on the emotional core of Fuji's earlier solo exhibition *Margatulus*, where the artist explored ancestry, sincerity, and the meaning of belonging. From that foundation, a creative voice rooted in authenticity emerged. In *Lakaran Kertas*, a previous paper-based presentation at KLAS, Fuji began to experiment more freely with the expressive potential of the medium. This latest exhibition takes that exploration even further.

Here, paper is no longer simply a surface. It becomes a field of emotion, a site of resistance, and a mirror of the artist's mind. The works range from quick, charged gestures to slow, layered meditations. The materials are acrylic, minimal ink, graphite, and pigment but the intensity is palpable. These are not sketches. These are testaments.



In *Mindscape: Perjuangan Series*, Fuji shows us that struggle is not just a matter of history. It's a state of being. It's a conversation between self and society, between memory and imagination. This exhibition is not loud. It does not shout. It speaks powerfully, truthfully through line, texture, movement, and silence.

The Future of Wellness in Asia

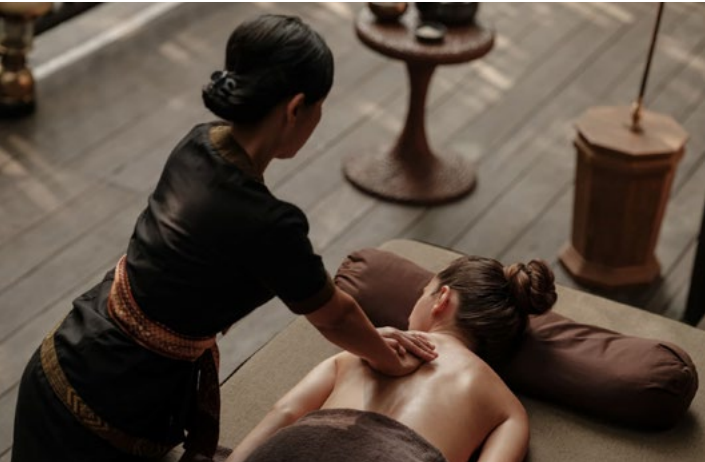
ANCIENT WISDOM, MODERN SCIENCE, AND THE RISE OF CONSCIOUS LIVING

Once prepared in village kitchens and passed down through generations, it is now being served in contemporary cafés in Bali and Jakarta, beautifully packaged and positioned as part of a modern wellness lifestyle.



In Malaysia, the traditional *urut Melayu*, a form of healing massage rooted in local heritage, is being incorporated into boutique wellness spaces that combine cultural rituals with calm, luxurious settings. Energy healing is also gaining visibility beyond temples and private homes, now practiced in urban studios and integrated into mainstream wellness programs. Traditional Chinese Medicine and Ayurveda are experiencing renewed interest as well, guided by a generation of healers who are comfortable with pulse reading and digital diagnostics.



This revival is not only about healing but also about reclaiming cultural identity. Young business owners and wellness advocates are building brands around the philosophies of balance, rhythm, and harmony passed down through their ancestors. For many, this is also an act of cultural preservation, a way to safeguard and celebrate traditional knowledge in a world that often prioritizes global trends over local heritage.

The High-Tech Turn

On the opposite end of the spectrum, Asia is rapidly embracing science and technology to enhance well-being. In places like Singapore, Seoul, and Tokyo, wellness now involves data tracking and smart analysis. People are using wearable devices to monitor their sleep cycles, gut health, hormone levels, and cognitive function. State-of-the-art wellness lounges offer oxygen therapy, cold treatments, red light therapy, and intravenous vitamin drips tailored to specific health goals like fatigue recovery or stress management.

Digital wellness is thriving. Meditation apps powered by artificial intelligence, guided visualizations, mindfulness platforms, and even virtual coaches are helping users integrate well-being into everyday life. In South Korea, cosmetic wellness has developed into a full ecosystem, where regenerative skincare blends seamlessly with preventive health strategies. Longevity centers and antiaging labs are no longer reserved for the elite. As accessibility increases, so does the vocabulary of wellness, with terms like metabolic flexibility, circadian rhythm regulation, and neuroplasticity now part of common conversations.



Mental and Emotional Fitness

One of the most significant transformations in Asia's wellness landscape is the growing openness around emotional and mental well-being. For many years, mental health was a subdued subject in Asian cultures.

Now, a new wave of awareness is breaking the silence. Therapy clinics, mental fitness apps, community support programs, and corporate coaching are emerging across the region.

Mindfulness and emotional healing practices are becoming mainstream. Breathwork sessions, guided journaling, somatic movement classes, and trauma healing retreats are now widely available in major cities.

Spiritual wellness is expanding beyond yoga to include inner child healing, intention-setting circles, and community-based wellness gatherings.

This shift is also cultural. There is a growing willingness to have honest conversations, to embrace vulnerability, and to heal together. Mental and emotional well-being is no longer seen as weakness or indulgence, it is recognized as essential.

The wellness journey is becoming less individual and more collective, where shared growth and connection are just as important as personal transformation.



Alpha International Sets New Global Benchmark In Workplace Wellbeing

Alpha International Training and Consultancy is leading a new approach to workplace wellbeing, setting global benchmarks and driving improvements in employee health and productivity both in Malaysia and internationally.

With the support of the United Nations, the Certified Fatigue and Fitness Accredited Programme, led by Professor Dr Louis Adaikalam, introduces Malaysia's first initiative that uses artificial intelligence to assess sleep, mental health, and stress.

The programme addresses critical challenges such as presenteeism, absenteeism, and rising healthcare costs. Professor Adaikalam believes that by using technology, organisations can predict potential health risks and prevent them before they escalate.

"What sets our approach apart is the use of advanced technologies to tackle challenges like fatigue and microsleep, which contribute to accidents at work and on the road," he said.

He explained that improving fitness and predicting risks like microsleep can significantly reduce accidents, especially among drivers. The programme offers early detection, targeted rehabilitation, and treatment to prevent such risks.

On June twenty fourth, Professor Adaikalam received the Malaysia Outstanding Entrepreneurs Award for twenty twenty five from the KSI Strategic Institute for Asia Pacific, presented by YAM Tunku Dato Seri Utama Naquiyuddin ibni Almarhum Tuanku Jaafar, the Tunku Laksamana and Former Regent of Negeri Sembilan.

He highlighted that partnerships with government agencies, private companies, and NGOs are key to the success of Alpha International's initiatives.

Collaborations with organisations such as HRDCorp, the Malaysia Productivity Corporation, and MIROS help align their programmes with national goals, including reducing road accidents and supporting the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.



Professor Adaikalam also raised concerns about sleep deprivation, which affects nine out of ten Malaysians and has become a major workforce challenge. He stressed the need for education on how fatigue impacts cognitive function and job performance.

"Our solutions go beyond telling people to sleep more. We show how fatigue accumulates and how it affects focus, safety, and productivity," he added.

The organization is preparing to plant and nurture the largest number of tree saplings in a nursery in Malaysia, aiming for official recognition by the Malaysia Book of Records. This ambitious effort is not just a record-breaking feat but also a symbol of generational commitment to environmental restoration and climate action.

The saplings, which include a variety of coastal and native mangrove species, will be grown in collaboration with local schools, indigenous communities, and university students. The project is designed not just to produce trees but to build climate resilience, biodiversity awareness, and a sense of shared responsibility for the planet.

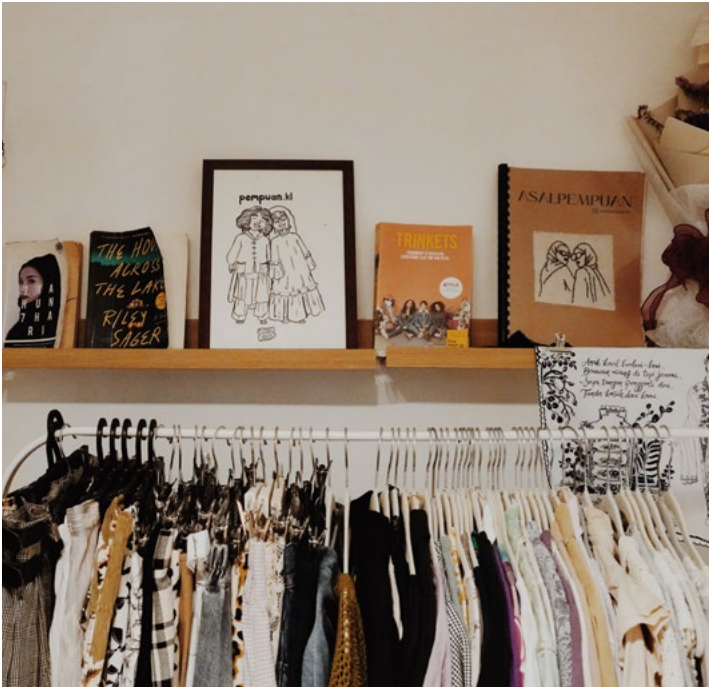

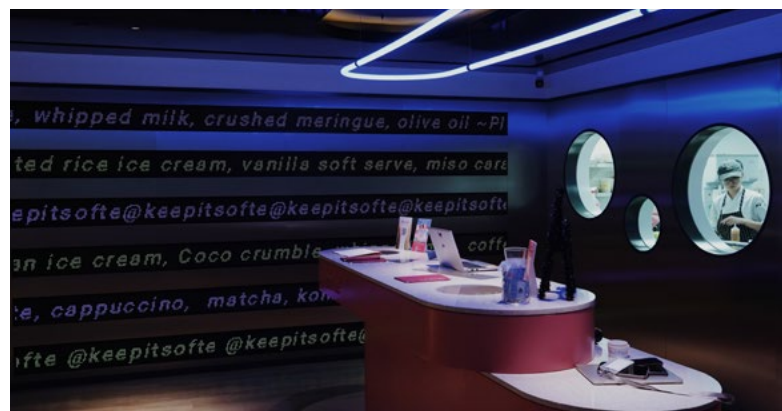
Strawberry Matcha with Float

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Phase One of Selangor Aero
Park @ KLIA Aeropolis Kicks Off

The recent launch of the Selangor Aero Park @ KLIA Aeropolis by Malaysia Airports and Menteri Besar Selangor Incorporated (MBI) marks a step closer towards Malaysia becoming a leading player in Asia Pacific's aerospace and advanced manufacturing landscape.

Spanning about 600 acres within the KLIA Aeropolis, this landmark development has a potential gross development value of RM2.3 billion.

To be developed over several phases, the Selangor Aero Park is expected to attract high-impact investments across the aerospace supply chain, including precision engineering and integrated logistics services.

It is anticipated to serve as a hub for innovation, talent development and technology transfer as well.

Covering 200 acres, phase one of the Selangor Aero Park is open for sale to potential investors, while the remaining 400-acre parcels of land will be progressively released beyond 2028, in accordance with infrastructure readiness and investor demand.

GE Aerospace secured 100 acres of land under phase one to develop an engine test cell as well as maintenance, repair and overhaul (MRO) facility to serve the Asia Pacific region.

Supported by a governance model led by Malaysia Airports and MBI to ensure seamless investment facilitation, the latter's presence as a strategic partner representing the Selangor state ensures that the tenant-operators and investors benefit from fast-track facilitation for business permits and development approvals, talent development programmes and incentives.

Dato' Seri Amirudin Shari, Menteri Besar of Selangor said, "By leveraging our strategic location, robust infrastructure and industrial strengths, we are building an enabling ecosystem where global aerospace players as well as local small and medium enterprises can thrive.

The Selangor Aero Park is envisioned to offer a complete ecosystem of aerospace activities encompassing MRO, aerospace parts manufacturing, avionics, propulsion and high-value electronics, as well as advanced supply chain facilities.

It will integrate smart security features such as closed-circuit television with facial and vehicle-plate number recognition, solar-powered street lighting on smart poles, smart billing and maintenance monitoring and green parks.

MBI will ensure a future-ready environment for the local aerospace industries that includes staff accommodations and commercial amenities apart from providing training and workforce development initiatives.

Malaysia Airports, on the other hand, is promoting renewable energy across Selangor Aero Park's facilities, including solar and rainwater harvesting.

Describing Selangor Aero Park as a catalyst in transforming the KLIA Aeropolis into a vibrant aviation and logistics hub, Malaysia Airports Chairman, Dr Nungsari Ahmad Radhi said, "This key milestone opens up multiple opportunities to enhance aviation-related infrastructure and services to meet the evolving needs of the industry and region."

Additionally, Selangor Aero Park's close proximity to the KL International Airport (KLIA) provides direct access to Asia Pacific's high-growth flight corridors and global markets, linking Malaysia's aerospace value chain to local and international demands.

Designed to offer built-to-suit and fully-serviced facilities to cater to original equipment manufacturers and Tier 1 aerospace players as well as high technology and high value supply chain operators, this synergistic aviation-linked development will enhance KLIA's core operations while attracting global investments.

With Selangor Aero Park's location easy access to Port Klang, this further strengthens its multi-modal logistics proposition.

As Transport Minister Anthony Loke Siew Fook put it at the ground breaking of the Selangor Aero Park, this development matters because it offers a seamless integration between air, land and sea - a multimodal hub designed for efficiency, precision and speed.

"It gives our exporters, manufacturers and innovators a new edge in a fast-changing region."

The Selangor Aero Park is a crucial element in the realisation of the vision of the Malaysian Aerospace Industry Blueprint 2030, to generate RM55.2 billion in annual aerospace revenue and create over 32,000 high-income jobs by 2030.

Enhancing Passengers' Experience with New Aero trains and More Connectivity

As Malaysia Airports continues to expand air connectivity into Malaysia with the entry of new foreign carriers and the launch of more new routes, its commitment to ensuring a smooth and seamless flow for its passengers remains top priority.

This is clearly demonstrated at its flagship KL International Airport (KLIA), which debuted its new Aero trains on 1 July 2025 following the successful completion of a major infrastructure upgrade planned three years ago.



With enhanced reliability, improved passenger flow and a stronger system resilience, KLIA is well-positioned to establish itself as a strong hub in Southeast Asia.

Dato' Mohd Izani Ghani, Managing Director of Malaysia Airports said, "We are grateful for the close and diligent oversight from the Land Public Transport Agency throughout the project and the strong support from the Ministry of Transport."

He explained, "The Aero train is a complex system that requires seamless integration across multiple components, all of which must meet stringent safety and performance standards set by the regulator.

This includes testing our emergency response plan to ensure we are ready for any eventuality."

The fault-free run involved a rigorous validation process in which the first train was required to complete 2,000 kilometres (km) of continuous fault-free operations, while the remaining two trains logged 1,000 km each, confirming the system's technical reliability and readiness.

"We also worked closely with our contractor, Alstom, and their consortium partners to deliver this project

Northern gateway's connectivity enhanced
Meanwhile, at Penang International Airport (PEN), which recently welcomed its 18th foreign airline, Cambodia Airways' (KR) twice-weekly service from Phnom Penh (PNH) using the Airbus A320 aircraft, this is KR's second international route to Malaysia, complementing its existing PNH-Kuala Lumpur (KUL) service.

On the country's second busiest airport's performance, he said Penang International Airport (PEN) recently welcomed its 18th foreign airline, Cambodia Airways' (KR) twice-weekly service from Phnom Penh (PNH) using the Airbus A320 aircraft.

This is KR's second international route to Malaysia, complementing its existing PNH-Kuala Lumpur (KUL) service.

Dato' Mohd Izani said, "As the second new airline to commence operations at PEN this year following Sichuan Airlines' (3U) start of its five weekly flights from Chengdu on 30 April 2025, KR's entry strengthens Penang's position as a key northern gateway and enhances our strategic role in advancing regional air connectivity.

"More importantly, this new direct link with PNH aligns with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Connectivity Master Plan 2025, reinforcing Malaysia's commitment to deeper regional integration.

"It opens new pathways for trade and cross-border collaboration, positioning Penang as a vital node in the ASEAN economic network."

Beyond Cambodia, PEN also offers direct flights to key members of the ASEAN bloc, including Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Vietnam and Myanmar, cementing its status as an emerging regional hub for commerce and tourism.

From January to May 2025, PEN recorded 3.4 million passengers, up 12% increase year-on-year. Of this, 53% were international passengers and the rest domestic passengers.



Direct Flights to and from Haikou and Kuala Lumpur by Hainan Airlines

Hainan Airlines' (HU) inaugural direct flight from Haikou (HAK) on 30 May 2025 is part of Malaysia Airports' strategic efforts to strengthen KL International Airport's network connectivity with China, one of its key target markets.

Partnership between China Southern Airlines and Vietnam Airlines to Start in August

Through this JV, which marks a significant step forward in its internationalisation strategy, he said, "We will build an air bridge between the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area and Vietnam, boosting regional economic, trade and cultural exchanges."

With 2025 being the China-Vietnam Year of People-to-People Exchange, new opportunities abound for the aviation market and growth in tourism.

Currently, CZ operates direct flights from Guangzhou, Shenzhen, Changsha, Wuhan, and Shanghai Pudong in China to Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh City and Nha Trang in Vietnam, with a peak weekly capacity of 111 flights.

Vietnam's flag carrier, on the other hand, provides direct services connecting Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City to Guangzhou, Shanghai, Beijing besides linking Nha Trang to Tianjin, Wuhan, Nanjing, Shanghai, Jinan, Changzhou, Wuxi.

During peak periods, VN operates over 50 weekly flights, providing extensive air connectivity between Vietnam and China.

Surreal Experiences and Creative Approaches to Boost Arrivals into Malaysia

Malaysia has set the stage to put itself on the world map as Asia's most loved country by making long and earnest preparations for its Visit Malaysia 2026 (VM2026) campaign to capture the hearts and imaginations of visitors through various strategic moves and action plans.

Its theme song for VM2026 entitled Surreal Experiences embeds the essence of the country's many unique offerings to attract global attention and engage its visitors with many enchanting experiences.

This is followed up by the Surreal Experiences Await promotional video to be updated quarterly to reflect its latest attractions and packages nationwide.

A production house was engaged to compile 200 short videos with RM1.9 million allocated for the project, according to the Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture (MoTAC).

Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture, Dato Sri Tiong King Sing said from January to April 2025, Malaysia received 13.38 million visitor arrivals, representing a 12.1% year-on-year (YoY) increase.

Further data for the first four months of 2025 released by its promotion arm, Tourism Malaysia, in cooperation with the Immigration Department showed Singapore leading with 6.5 million visitor arrivals as the top source country, followed by Indonesia (1.47 million), China (1.44 million), Thailand (833,610), India (484,791) and Brunei (480,916).

With visa exemption allowing Chinese tourists to stay in

Malaysia for up to 90 days (from 30 days previously) extended until 31 December 2026, with further potential extension until 2036, the policy encourages longer visits and spending for this key market.

Average spending per visitor rose to RM4,300, with tourism receipts reaching RM27.5 billion for the first quarter of 2025, up 24% YoY, inclining towards higher value visitors.

PayNet recently partnered with Alipay and Weixin Pay, also known as WeChat Pay, to drive mainland Chinese and regional spending across Malaysia whereby visitors can scan DuitNow QR codes using their Alipay and Weixin Pay eWallets at over 2.5 million merchants here.

Malaysia, named Asia's most loved country for 2024 by United States-based financial website Insider Monkey, has not only overtaken Thailand, which ranked second with 9.55 million arrivals but also in terms of Chinese arrivals.

With Asia back on the radar due to the rising turmoil in the Middle East, Malaysia is experiencing a surge in visitor arrivals and is increasing its focus on high impact tourism and cultural events besides coming up with more innovative programmes.

Niche segment

Among them is birding tourism, said to contribute about 10% to 30% to the global tourism industry. Malaysia is ranked fourth in Asia for birding after China, India and Thailand.

Fraser's Hill, one of the country's top bird watching

destinations, is home to more than 250 species of birds. Migratory birds stop at this hill station from Siberia, Russia and the northern islands of the southern hemisphere between October and April.

This 'green jewel', bordering the states of Selangor and Pahang, recently held its 36 th Fraser's Hill International Bird Race jointly organised by Tourism Pahang, BirdLife International and the Malaysian Nature Society from 21 to 22 June 2025.

Marked a bumper year, the event recorded the highest participation from 127 teams, of which 50 teams were international. It also set a new record of 71 participants for the Bird Photography Contest.



The international participants came from Australia, Bhutan, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Nepal, the Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam and the United States.

More than just a competition, the bird race is pivotal in promoting eco and niche tourism, while supporting the local community and its businesses, from accommodation providers, restaurant operators, tourist attractions to food vendors.

Stargazing adventures

Datin Rafidah Aziz, Tourism Malaysia's Senior Director of Domestic and Events Division said, "As part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability and responsible tourism, we have introduced experiences such as stargazing as a unique opportunity to reconnect with nature while raising awareness about environmental preservation.

"Stargazing also opens doors for local communities through guided experiences, homestays and eco-tourism packages."

She added that Tourism Malaysia collaborated with 16 tour operators to create 37 such stargazing packages nationwide for travel until December 2026.

During its recently concluded 'Star Healing Programme' in Kuala Selangor organised for the media and travel agents to create more awareness about such packages, cultural visits and sustainable activities such as the planting of durian seedlings at the Selangor Fruit Valley were included.

Workshops on astronomy photography and how to make your own telescope were also organised for the participants in collaboration with Canon Malaysia and Sahabat Langit Utara.

Meanwhile, as Malaysia ramps up preparations for the upcoming World Tourism Day (WTD) and the World Tourism Conference (WTC), it hopes to attract 1,000 high-profile global tourism leaders, policy makers, academicians and delegates to attend this event organised by United Nations World Tourism Organization.

To be held from 27 to 29 September 2025 in historic Melaka, both Melaka and Malaysia is expected to have a substantial impact on the hosting of WTD and WTC 2025.

The theme for WTD 2025, Tourism and Sustainable Tourism, emphasizes the vital role tourism plays in supporting the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals, including inclusivity, responsibility and resilience.

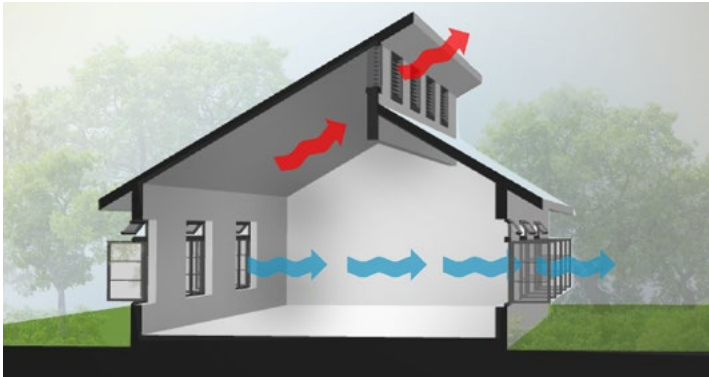

Tan Choh Tee is regarded as one of Singapore's most prominent painters, known for his ability to preserve the spirit of the nation's past through his distinctive Impressionist style. Born in 1942 in Guangdong, China, Tan relocated to Singapore in 1953, a move that would shape his life and artistic journey.

His formal training began at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, where he studied under some of the leading figures of Singapore's art scene. It was here that he developed a strong foundation in Eastern and Western artistic traditions, a dual influence that continues to inform his work.

Over the decades, Tan Choh Tee has established himself as a key figure in documenting Singapore's rapidly evolving urban landscape. His *plein air*, or outdoor paintings are particularly celebrated for their ability to capture the fleeting charm of old Singapore.

Scenes of Chinatown's bustling markets, the historic Singapore River, and the rustic simplicity of kampong villages feature prominently in his work, serving as visual records of places and moments that have all but disappeared beneath the city's modern skyline.

Tan's works are distinguished by his mastery of color and brushwork. Employing a rich, vibrant palette, he brings life to familiar street scenes, architectural facades, and everyday moments. His expressive, confident brushstrokes evoke the atmosphere and character of each scene, whether it is the early morning bustle of a marketplace or the quiet, sunlit corner of a shophouse-lined street. The interplay of light and shadow in his paintings adds depth and mood, reflecting his keen observation and deep affection for his surroundings.

Choo Keng Kwang's 1977 painting, *Singapore River* stands as a significant example of his work that captures the spirit of Singapore's cultural heritage. Inspired by traditional shadow puppetry and theatrical traditions, this body of work reflects Ghani's ongoing interest in examining the human condition and offering social commentary through the language of abstract expressionism.

The *Siri Wayang* series is recognized for its energetic compositions and layered visual narratives. These works often invite reflection on the complexity of human behavior and the structures that shape society. *Ketulan II*, a piece from this series, continues this exploration by delving into the symbolic relationship between masks, performances, and the often concealed roles that individuals assume in public and private life.

Through bold forms, dynamic brushwork, and abstract symbolism, Ghani challenges viewers to consider the blurred line between appearance and reality, and the theatrical nature of human interaction.

Syed Ahmad Jamal was one of Malaysia's most influential modern artists and a leading figure in art education. He is widely recognized for his role in shaping the development of modern art in Malaysia and was honored as a National Art Laureate, or Seniman Negara, in 1995. From 1983 to 1991, he served as the Director of the National Art Gallery, known today as Balai Seni Negara, where he played an important role in promoting modern and abstract art and worked tirelessly to strengthen public support for Malaysian artists and the arts.

Throughout his career, Syed Ahmad Jamal developed a distinctive style that combines modern abstraction with elements of Islamic, Malay, and broader Asian artistic traditions. His work often reflects a deep engagement with spiritual ideas, architectural forms, and geometric structures. Using bold color palettes and expressive compositions, his paintings evoke intellectual depth and emotional resonance. *KMJSN* is a striking example of this artistic approach, demonstrating his ability to merge cultural heritage with modern visual language.

Khoo Sui Hoe, born in 1939 in Kedah, is one of Malaysia's leading fine artists. He studied at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts in Singapore and later at the Pratt Graphic Center in New York. Over the years, he has received several awards, including first prize in the Malaysian Art and Craft competition in 1965 and the John D. Rockefeller 3rd Fund Grant in 1974.

Khoo's *4 Clouds Landscape* (1971) is a striking oil on canvas measuring 87 by 100 centimeters with frame. Signed "Sui Hoe 71" in the lower right, the painting blends surrealism with expressive landscapes. Bold red hills and four stylized clouds create a dreamlike balance between land and sky, capturing Khoo's signature style.

Eng Tay is known for his ability to convey quiet emotion and poetic simplicity, and *The Young Beauty* reflects his lifelong interest in themes of intimacy, femininity, and tradition. Created in his signature style, the painting features soft contours and a warm, muted color palette. The young figure appears timeless and immediate, portrayed with a sense of serene stillness and quiet reflection.

Tay's early years in Malaysia, combined with his artistic education in New York, shaped his distinctive visual language. 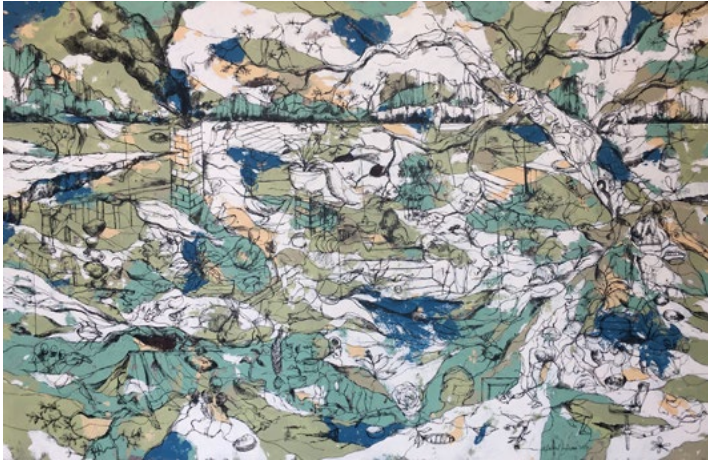
