Gentle koi ponds, teeming with vibrant fish, add a soothing element, while intricately designed archways invite exploration and reflection.





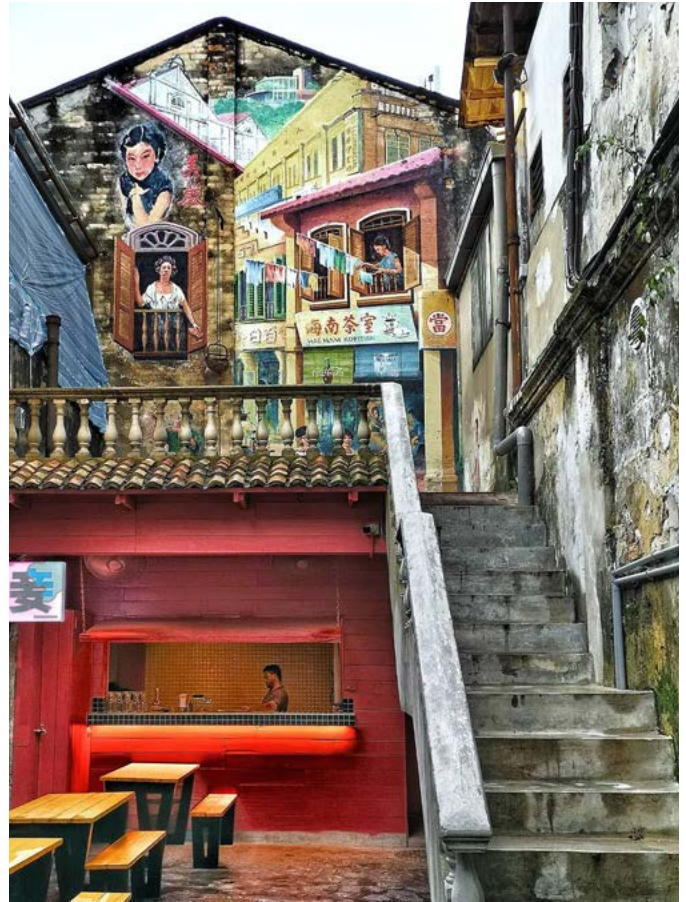
Kwai Chai Hong

Surrounding the alley are an array of charming cafes and boutique shops, each contributing to the area's unique blend of old-world charm and modern creativity.

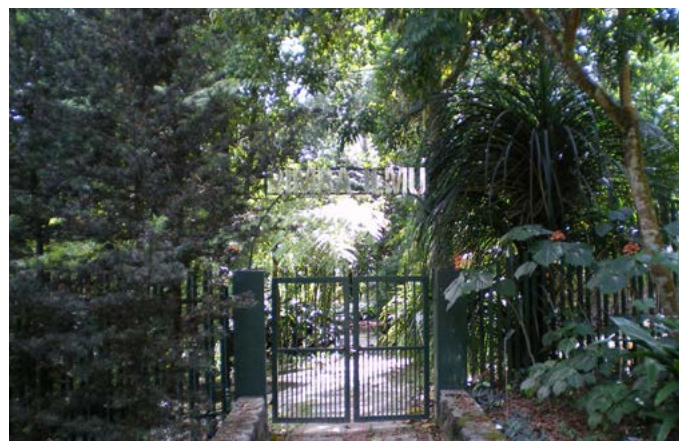

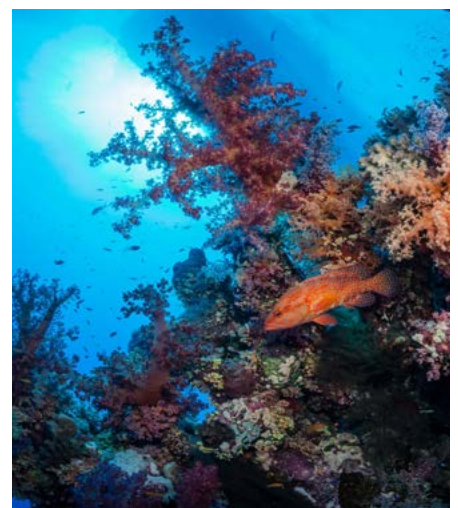


Pulau Rusukan Besar

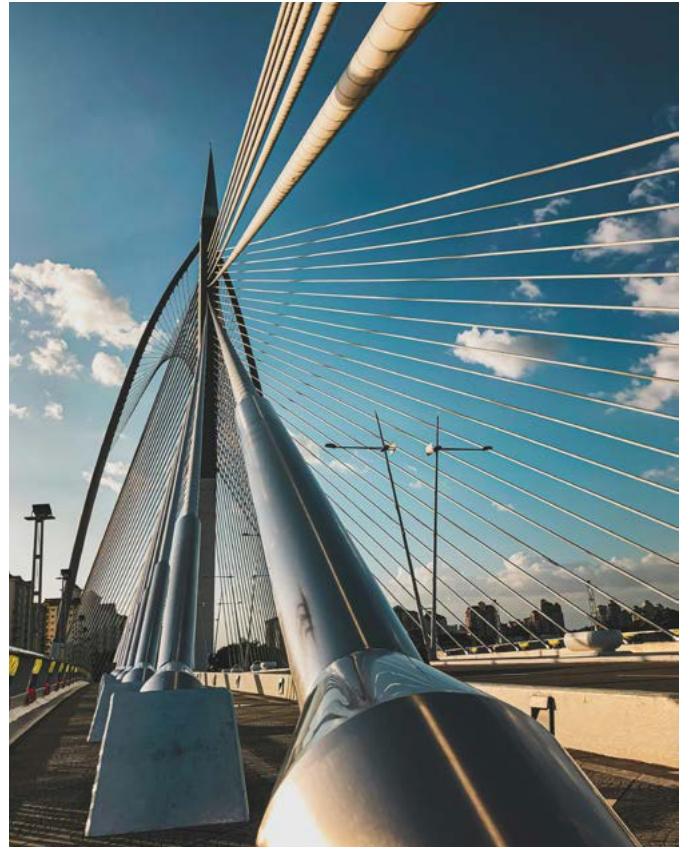
